Intelligence-led policing is here to stay. In the last five years its principles and practice have become increasingly well established in police forces and other law enforcement agencies. Implementation of the National Intelligence Model (NIM), produced by NCIS for the Association of Chief Police Officers (ACPO), is a cornerstone of government policing policy. The importance of the NIM was again underlined in the recent White Paper on Serious and Organised Crime that set out plans for the creation of a Serious Organised Crime Agency (SOCA).

Development of the NIM and supporting systems continues. Key themes of this conference concern such issues as how intelligence systems can contribute to the setting up of harm reduction focused strategies; how those engaged in academic research, operational practice and policy-making can together support the continuing development of professionalism and new techniques, and how the rapid increase in information and intelligence can be effectively 'knowledge managed' by both practitioners and analysts.

This conference will bring together key figures in the practice of law enforcement, research and policy who are concerned with these and other issues in local, national and international law enforcement. The speakers will reveal many of the exciting new ideas that will take intelligence-led law enforcement forward from its strong beginnings.
